Parks & Recreation

The Township would like to thank everyone who used the Park, pavilion and all of the park facilities this year. We hope to see you in the Spring.

This year the Township and the Park Board submitted an application for funding from the Local Share Account to purchase new playground equipment and new ball field fencing where needed. The Park Board is also working on constructing a new concession stand.

Township Tax Collection

Per Pennsylvania Act 32 of 2008, Local Earned Income Tax will be withheld for all taxpayers by their employers, and paid to Keystone Collections Group of Irwin, Pa. Taxes will then be submitted on the employee's behalf from Keystone to South Franklin Township. These changes will take effect on all wages earned after Jan. 1, 2012.

South Franklin residents will continue the 2011 tax year as usual, making quarterly payments and filing final forms through the Township office.

Consol has been coal mining in the Southwestern portion of the Township near Pleasant Grove Road and operations will be steadily moving North along Route 221. Consol is also in the beginning stages of developing pads for Marcellus shale drilling in the Township. Well pads will be located off of Farmer Lane (2), Bethel Church Road and Old Scales Road. Ordinance Information

Per ordinance 160-8 of the Township, all residences must post their house number clearly on the house, mailbox or post. Numbers must be Arabic figures at least three inches high and one-half inch wide. Reflective number signs are available for purchase at the VFD for a nominal fee. Franklin Manor Projects

United Survey has completed the cleaning and relining of the Franklin Manor sewer system. In the Spring of 2012, a road reconstruction project for a portion of Annuity Drive will begin. This is the first phase of a larger project to address the deteriorating conditions of Manor roads.

Operation Christmas Child

Operation Christmas Child is a global gift exchange project that is operated by Samaritan's Purse, which is a humanitarian organization that assists people in need. This specific project collects "shoebboxes" filled with toys, school supplies, clothing, and other general needs. This program is operated every November in preparation for the upcoming holidays. At the end of the collection, over 8,000 boxes were brought to South Franklin. These boxes will be distributed to children in over 130 countries.
